Hispanic Heritage Month

EQUITABLE ACCESS







Ensuring equitable access to healthcare services for rural and vulnerable individuals is crucial in promoting the well-being of the broader community. The journey towards equitable access to healthcare begins by ensuring vulnerable working people without health insurance or job security can experience culturally competent care. It is also vital to make healthcare affordable through application assistance, slide fee scales, , subsidies and tailored insurance options. Community health workers play a key role in outreach, education and impact. Stable, targeted investment in rural-specific health education and prevention programs is essential, especially for historically marginalized communities. Recognizing and addressing the social determinants of health, promoting collaboration, advocating for supportive policies, conducting research, prioritizing patient-centered care, and ensuring emergency preparedness are all essential steps towards creating equitable healthcare access in our region. We believe all people have the right to live happy healthy lives. Dignity in health care saves lives, and we are dedicated to ensuring the most vulnerable receive equitable, accessible care.



MATERNAL HEALTH



Current social determinants of health challenges pregnant farmworker women served by Sembrando Salud by NC FIELD:

- Mariana has traveled to four different states in the past six months along the east coast migrant stream. During that time she has worked in tobacco, grapes, blueberries, and tomatoes. She is barely twenty years old and a first-time expectant mother. With no personal transportation, long work days, and limited English-speaking skills, she is in her second trimester without access to prenatal care.
- Leticia is in her late thirties. She and her husband are living in one room with access to a bathroom but not a kitchen. She speaks an indigenous language and very little Spanish. When her pregnancy became apparent she was let go from her job in the tobacco fields. The heat was a real problem for a while inside the small room, and donors helped us supply an air conditioner. We continue to reach out to contacts in the Faison area about better housing. The baby was born recently, small but healthy.

Farm and Food Workers Relief Program (FFWR)



Our dedicated NC FIELD team continues to work hard to process the applications for the Food and Farmworkers Relief Program. We are edging closer to our goal of 4,000 applications! Our outcomes continue to meet our goal with 550 applications created in September and an updated total of \$1,401,600 to assist the agriculture workforce that worked tirelessly to make sure that we were fed throughout the pandemic. NC FIELD will continue the project through the end of 2024. Angel and his team are shifting their focus to the seasonal agricultural workforce and will begin H2A migrant worker applications again early spring of 2024.


